

Heartland Federal Partners' Grant Writing Virtual Workshop Series – Oct. 6, Oct. 13, Oct. 20

The Kansas State Technical Assistance to Brownfields (TAB) Program, in partnership with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 7 (IA, MO, KS, NE), the EPA Region 7 States, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and the United States Department of Agriculture – Rural Development (USDA-RD), invites you to **attend a free virtual grant writing workshop series** to learn about the fundamentals of applying for federal grants.

Session 1: Nuts and Bolts of Writing a Federal Grant Application, EJScreen Demo & Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool

Thursday, October 6, 2022 – 1:00 to 3:50 PM CT

Session 1 will summarize key steps to the federal grant application process and identify best practices. Attendees will learn how to address key grant application components, such as community needs and goals, budget, community engagement and partnerships, and measuring results. A demonstration of EPA's EJScreen Tool and an introduction to the new Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool are included as well.

Session 2: Environmental Justice, EPA Grant Program Overviews and Grant Recipient Panel

Thursday, October 13, 2022 – 1:00 to 3:40 PM CT

Session 2 will consist of an overview of EPA's Environmental Education, Environmental Justice, and Brownfields competitive grant programs with special emphasis on how to address environmental justice. Successful grantees of the respective grant programs will share tips and insights for writing a good grant proposal and how to overcome application obstacles.

Session 3: EPA Job Training and Federal Partners Grant Program Overviews and Grant Recipient Panel

Thursday, October 20, 2022 – 1:00 to 2:50 PM CT

Session 3 will introduce the competitive grant programs of USDA-Rural Development and HUD and EPA's Job Training Grant program. Successful grantees of the respective grant programs share tips and insights for writing a good grant proposal and how to overcome application obstacles.

All workshops will conclude with optional availability sessions open to all attendees to consult with presenters about attendees' special projects.

Who should attend? Local, Tribal, and regional government officials, economic development staff, not-for-profit, economic, and community-based organizations, and others interested in financial resources for community revitalization.
